WHAT ARE INDULGENCES AND HOW TO OBTAIN THEM

The word 'INDULGENCE' comes from the Latin noun *indulgentia*, which is derived from the word *indulgere*, meaning to grant or to concede. Canon 992 of the 1983 Code of Canon Law defines in indulgence in the following manner: *An indulgence is the remission, in the sight of God, of the temporal punishment due for sins, the guilt of which has already been forgiven.*

It is to be borne in mind that in the Catholic Church whenever a baptized person commits any mortal sin, two things are to be distinguished: guilt and punishment. Through the Sacrament of Penance, the guilt is forgiven, but the punishment attached to sin remains. The penitent performs sacramental satisfaction imposed by the Confessor and partly atones for the temporal punishment due to sin so that he/she guards against falling into sin again, the other part of the temporal punishment is remitted by gaining of indulgences granted by the Church. Hence, in order to remit the other part of the temporal punishment, which is due to sin, the Church has devised means called 'indulgences."

In granting indulgences, the Church, using its power to bind and loose, (Mt. 16, 18-19) as minister of Christ the Lord's redemption, not only offers prayer, but authoritatively dispenses to the faithful, rightly disposed, the treasury of the expiatory works of Christ, of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of all the Saints for the remission of temporal punishment. The purpose intended by Ecclesiastical authority in gaining indulgences is not only to help the faithful to pay the penalties due to sin, but also to encourage them to perform works of devotion, repentance, and charity – especially works that contribute to the growth of faith and the good of the community.

An indulgence is partial or plenary, accordingly as it partially or wholly frees a person from temporal punishment due for sins (Cn 993). All members of the faithful can gain partial or plenary indulgences either for themselves personally or they can apply them by way of suffrage to the dead (Cn994). In this latter case the Church makes an offering of satisfaction to God on behalf of the souls in Purgatory. An indulgence for the living cannot be applied to any other living person than the one who gains it.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day, except by those,

who are on the threshold of death. A partial indulgence may be gained multiple times a day, unless something different is explicitly stated. The requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence are the performance of the indulgenced work and the fulfillment of three conditions: 1) Sacramental Confession, 2) Eucharistic Communion, 3) Prayer for the Pope's intentions. A further requirement is the exclusion of all attachment to sin, even venial sin. Unless this unqualified disposition and the three conditions are present, the indulgence will be only partial. The work prescribed for acquiring a plenary indulgence connected with a Church or oratory consists of a devout visit during which an "Our Father' and the 'Creed' are recited. The condition of paying for the Pope's intention is fully satisfied by reciting one 'Our Father' and one "Hail Mary;' nevertheless one has the option of reciting any other prayer suited for their own devotion and their reverence for the Pope.

AN INDULGENCE IS GRANTED FOR EACH OF THE FOLLOWING PRACTICES OF PIETY.

- 1. Recitation of the "third part" of the Rosary in the Church or in the family or in the Religious Community.
- 2. Recitation of the Angelus at all three hours of the day.
- 3. Recitation of the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Loretto.
- 4. Recitation of the Acts of faith, Hope and Charity.
- 5. Half an hour adoration.
- 6. Half an hour Scripture reading.
- 7. Way of the Cross.
- 8. Recitation of a prayer before the crucifix on Fridays of Lent and Passion tide.
- 9. Solemn recitation of *Tantum Ergo* on Maundy Thursday and on the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.
- 10. Adoration of the Holy Cross on Good Friday in the Liturgical function and kissing it.
- 11. Renewal of the baptismal promises during the Easter Vigil Service and on the anniversary of one's Baptism.
- 12. Public recitation of *Veni Creator* on 1st January and on the feast of Pentecost.
- 13. Public recitation of the Act of Reparation at the feast of Sacred Heart.
- 14. Public recitation of the Act of Dedication on the feast of Christ the King.
- 15. Public recitation of *Te Deum* on the last day of the Civil Year. (31st

December)

- 16. Deout visitation of the Cemetery while at least mentally praying for the Souls in Purgatory from 1st to 8th November. On each of these days a plenary indulgence can be gained for the Souls in Purgatory.
- 17. Participating in a spiritual retreat at least for three full days.
- 18. Visiting of the Parochial Church or Cathedral Church on the titular feast day.
- 19. Visiting of the Church or Oratory on all souls day. It must be applied for the Souls in Purgatory.
- 20. The faithful who use with devotion an object of piety (crucifix, cross, rosary, scapular or medal) blessed by the Pope or any Bishop can acquire a plenary indulgence on the feast of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul provided they also make a profession of faith using the legitimate formula.
- 21. To the faithful who in danger of death cannot be assisted by a priest to bring them the Sacraments and impart the apostolic blessing with the attached plenary indulgence, provided they are properly disposed and have been in habit of reciting some prayers during their lifetime.
- 22. All the newly ordained priests are given the faculty to impart the papal blessing with the plenary indulgence once only on the occasion of their solemn first thanks giving Eucharist.
- 23. Pious Invocations: (to be recited any time of the day)

Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner!

Lord, increase my faith!

My Lord and my God!

Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!

Jesus my Lord, I love you above all things!

Sacred Heart of Jesus, may Your Kingdom come!

SOME PARTIAL INDULGENCES GRANTED TO ALL THE FAITHFUL

ST. PAUL, A MISSIONARY PAR EXCELLENCE

Of all the missionaries, St.Paul stands out as the one who travelled the most, the length and breadth of the ancient world enduring hardships and difficulties of travelling. His endurance and tenacity helped him to achieve his goal and convert large numbers to Christian faith. Looking back on his life, St Paul was born in Tarsus, in the province of Cilicia, of Jewish parents who maintained with great care their pharisaic tradition and pious customs. As the traditions goes, on the occasion of his circumcision he was given the name Saul after the first Jewish king, and in addition a Roman name, Paulus, as was then the custom among Jews who were Roman citizens.

As he grew up, he learnt the art of tent making to make him self-supportive in the later years. While he was still young, he was sent to Jerusalem to study Jewish law under the famous rabbi Gamaliel, and being Roman citizens, they had special rights and privileges. They could not be imprisoned without a trial nor could they be scourged and crucified. His Roman citizenship saved Paul many times from harsh condemnation during his ministry. He made three great missionary journeys before being arrested in Jerusalem and taken to Rome where he was beheaded in 62 AD.

During his early life Paul was responsible for the persecutions and death of many Christians including St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. He planned to persecute Christians even abroad and bring them back bound in chains. It was on one such undertaking that he experienced the conversion of his life, from being a fierce persecutor to be an ardent missionary.

He undertook three missionary journeys and worked enthusiastically and zealously to proclaim Christ. Some of the features of his ministry are as follows:

- 1 His missionary call: He is proud of being an "apostle", someone sent on a mission, even though he was not one of the twelve. He took his sacred task given by the risen lord as a ministry and not as an occupation and fulfilled it with a fervent zeal and enthusiasm.
- **2 Universal mission:** His acceptance of the call to be the apostle to the gentiles shows the universality of the mission. Jews considered themselves as the chosen people leaving gentiles out. But for Paul even the gentiles are now invited to be members of God's new family of faith. There were virtually no limits to His mission. His missionary undertakings had no boundaries. It was open to all.
- 3 Focus is Jesus Christ: The main content of his message was

proclaiming the "Gospel of Christ". Christ was the center of his preaching, teaching and catechising. In short, the Gospel was about the salvation that has come in with Jesus Christ, who by His life, ministry and even more by His death on a Cross and Resurrection has given the world.

4 Hope in the face of suffering: Paul had to undergo physical as well as emotional hardships during his mission to the gentiles. In the second letter to the Corinthians he highlights the extreme hazards encountered by missionaries of his day: imprisonments, receiving beatings, shipwreck, attack by robbers, rejection by Jews and gentiles, experiencing hunger and thirst, insomnia, emotional concern for his Churches and so on. (2 Cor 11,21-29). He insists that such sufferings are a way of proving that one is indeed fulfilling the ministry entrusted to him. He retains his hope even in the midst of such trial which, in fact, strengthens him.






